

"This Is The Place For Me"

It's a long trail since two men took a cruise in a very small yacht from Jacksonville to Punta Rassa. No Palm Beach, no Miami of today, but a crude landing at a crude hotel on stilts eight to ten feet high filled with tired but happy sportsmen needing rest from nagging responsibilities of business, who were made comfortable by a genial host and his wife, Mr. and Mrs. Schultz.

The men were made over in a short time by the relaxation they found in the old *real* fishing days of that long ago.

Mr. Schultz was in charge of the last telegraph communications plant between North and South America. It being a Western Union Station in which line Mr. Edison and Mr. Gilliland, our travelers, were associated an avenue of mutual interest was established. After being heartily received they were urged to take time from their quest to sail up the then little known beautiful Caloosahatchee to which they consented. Fascination grew until by the time of their arriving at the little hamlet of two hundred people or thereabouts, Fort Myers, they were ready to say "this is the place for me."

With one accord the real estate agent was found, the acreage of Seminole Lodge was purchased with the idea of being one mile and a quarter from the center of life of the place, as plenty of space and quiet was the aim.

In another year and a half Thomas A. Edison and his bride were established for a life-time of experience just sixty years ago in houses constructed of lumber transported from Maine to Fort Myers by water. There was a loss of one shipment and there were many vicissitudes, but the achievement was accomplished by the usual perseverence and determination of our great pioneer.

Remembrances of events of happy years are interwoven with Research and Recreation, ever mindful of the growth of this quaint and beautiful center of activity. It is difficult to realize that the Fort Myers of today has developed from houses in this area that had to be built on stilts or be washed away. It is hard to realize that the approach to Fort Myers was made by water from Punta Gorda, after a ten hours sail, on a boat somewhat fashioned after the type of a New York ferry, or by a haphazard drive of practically twenty-four hours from Arcadia through wild country and with snakes in abundance, swamps and adventures of various description, arriving exhausted but tremendously impressed with the possibilities of a great state, to which promise Florida has arrived and Fort Myers one of the most beautiful and prosperous settlement in it.

May the richness of God's blessings continue and Fort Myers ever remain the dignified and exemplary town it has always been in the past.

... About Charles A. Edison

O

HARLES EDISON, justly eminent in his own right, despite having grown to maturity in the shadow of his famous father, has spent numerous winter seasons in Fort Myers, but that of 1918 undoubtedly stands out in his memory. For it was then that he was married here, with attendant circumstances worthy of an imaginative scenarist.

The scene was set when Charles, without revealing the object of his request, asked his mother to invite as her house guest Miss Carolyn Hawkins, of Cambridge, Massachusetts. Upon her arrival, they entered into the swim of social events. One such affair, a dance at the Royal Palms Hotel, had the effect of speeding Charles' plans for getting Caroline to say "Yes," because unanticipated complications arose. Another young man was vying for her attention. Charles lost no time. He asked the question, received Carolyn's affirmative reply, and then informed his mother to prepare for a small informal wedding at which only friends of the family would be invited.

The scenario began to take shape, because when Charles and Carolyn set forth quietly to obtain their wedding license they made a slight error in destination, and were informed by an attendant: "This is the telephone office. You'll have to go to City Hall for a marriage license." Having corrected this false start by proceeding to the municipal building, Charles and Carolyn approached the marriage license clerk who—of all persons—turned out to be the young man who had paid strong court to Miss Hawkins at the previous night's dance.

At this point a really inspired scenarist might have pictured the clerk as steadfastly refusing to issue the necessary certificate in an effort to thwart his successful rival, but the facts are the opposite and the wedding went off on schedule.

The ceremony took place on March 27, 1918, under the shade of a cinnamon tree on the lawn of the home of the bridegroom's parents. A flower-covered sideboard, hastily requisitioned from the dining room, served as an altar. In the absence of her husband, who was on a business trip away from Fort Myers, Mrs. Thomas A. Edison gave the bride away. Multi-colored tropical blooms picked in the Edison gardens served as the bridal bouquet. "I have yet to see another bouquet so gorgeous," Mrs. Charles Edison said in recalling her wedding day.

Although Charles Edison was educated as an electrical engineer at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, his abilities were to gain his recog-


nition in the fields of business and public service. He directed a reorganization of his father's manifold enterprises in 1926 and, as president of Thomas A. Edison, Incorporated, with headquarters at West Orange, New Jersey, has guided their activities ever since.

His interest in public service was crystalized by the arrival of the depression. Acting on the belief that business men should take a more prominent part in public affairs, he began service in 1933 on the New Jersey State Recovery Board and the Regional Labor Board organized under the National Recovery Act. Edison then assisted in the preparation of legislation that created the Federal Housing Administration, and in 1934 he served as Regional Director of the Federal Housing Administration for the region embracing New Jersey, Pennsylvania, Delaware and Maryland. Early in 1935 President Roosevelt appointed Edison a member of the National Industrial Recovery Board in Washington.

On November 17, 1936, President Roosevelt summoned him to more important duties, appointing him Assistant Secretary of the Navy under Secretary Claude A. Swanson. Following Mr. Swanson's death, Edison was advanced by President Roosevelt to full cabinet status on December 30. 1939. While serving with the Navy Department, first as assistant secretary and later as the secretary, Edison fashioned an outstanding record by pioneering in the building of battleships with engines of revolutionary design which threw into discard longstanding ideas concerning battleship construction; in the introduction of PT Boats, which proved such an effective addition to the Navy in World War II; and in effecting other improvements within the Navy Department.

In his first and only entry into campaign politics, Edison was elected Governor of New Jersey and served a three-year term which ended January 17, 1944. At that time he retired to devote full time to his duties as president of the Edison industries. As Governor, he successfully sponsored sweeping tax reforms, model management-labor legislation, and improvements within the State's judiciary.

In addition to his corporate duties, Edison now serves as chairman of United Service to China (formerly United China relief); chairman of the board of Town Hall, Inc., New York City; and as trustee of Hotchkiss School at Lakeville, Conn.

Edison Discovered Fort Myers

THE NAME and fame of Thomas A. Edison is a world-wide legend. Florida is a legendary state. Any story in which the names of Edison and Florida are coupled, therefore, should not stick too closely to dates and routine events. As far as dates are concerned, suffice it to say that Mr. Edison "discovered" Fort Myers in 1885 and returned here the next year with his bride, Mina Miller Edison, to make a home on the banks of the Caloosahatchee.

It must have been about 1887 that Edison built his first laboratory on his Fort Myers estate, imported a steam engine, dynamo, and gave the pioneer Fort Myers citizens their first taste of incandescent light. There is a story that Edison offered to light Fort Myers with electricity free of charge but that the village officials turned down the offer because they thought the glass enclosed lights would keep the cattle and chickens awake at night.

From 1885 until his death in 1931, Edison spent at least part of every year but one in Fort Myers, which he was fond of calling his "adopted home" where he came to spend "working vacations." The one year he missed was during the first World War when he volunteered his inventive genius to help the United States solve the submarine menace. He did invent submarine detectors which were of great value and other devices of his are still filed in active war department secret archives. If he were alive today he would be busy helping the national defense program.

Many people have forgotten that after he had first gained world-wide acclaim for his inventions, the story was that Edison was broken in health. The New York World sent a special correspondent to Fort Myers to interview the electrical wizard. Here is a quote from the interview in which Mr. Edison said: "The air here in Fort Myers is perfect; the weather, as you see, is beautiful and the days are a constant succession of blue skies and warm sunshine, and to all this I owe my rapidly returned health."

It was somewhat later that he said, "There is only one Fort Myers and ninety million people are going to find it out."

The present Edison home was prefabricated in Maine and shipped to Florida by schooner. He built a half-mile-long pier out into the river and lighted it with electricity. He launched the first electric yacht in the world on the placid waters of the Caloosahatchee. He loved to sit on the dock and fish. But he didn't care about catching fish.

He would walk out with a cane pole and dangle a line in the water. If people came to talk with him he would put a finger to his lips for silence on the old theory that noise scares away the fish. Those who kept quiet while Edison kept on thinking did not know that he did not even have a hook on the end of his line.

But he liked to talk with old fishermen like Capt. E. L. Evans and W. Ashby Jones. They bragged about big tarpon. He gave out an interview that scared them. He said he had invented an electric lure and that he could go out and kill any fish that even nibbled his bait by pushing a button. Mr. Edison liked a practical joke. One time a bunch of titled Englishmen and New York dignitaries came to visit him. Before dinner they told stories they had heard of the toughness of Florida beef steak. Edison went out to his laboratory and cut up a thick rubber and web belt into the size of steaks and had the belting served for dinnercovered with gravy. They say he laughed 30 minutes as his guests, trying to be polite, attempted to cut up the pseudo steaks.

Edison believed in work but liked physical comfort. During his last years in Fort Myers, he was visited by Joe Mitchell Chapple with whom he had collaborated on the publication of "Heart Throbs" and "Heart Songs." Mr. Edison loved the old poems and the old songs. After exchanging a chew of tobacco, Joe put his hands on Edison's shoulders and said: "Well, old timer, if I don't see you again in this world I'll see you in heaven."

"I don't know about that, Joe," said Edison. "Florida is just about as near heaven as I hope to get."


It was Edison back in 1905 who first urged the city fathers to line the avenues with royal palms. He bought and paid for the first schooner-loads of palms and today Fort Myers is known as the "City of Palms." The Edison estate with its many rare imported trees, orchid row and beautiful flora is a jungle-like botanical garden not to be compared with any other planting in Florida.

As he grew older, Edison's birthday became more of an event and it brought many famous persons to Fort Myers who were privileged to claim friendship with the "living immortal." It was the occasion for an annual interview in which Edison answered all questions. The writers and reporters would work for days and nights on a list of approximately forty questions covering practically every subject in the world.








Gopher Derby. Three Races going at the same time in separate circles.



Mr. Edison would sit down, sharpen a stub pencil with a pocket pointer and then give pat answers to all the questions in less time than it took to type them. Everything Edison said was news. He didn't waste words. Among those who usually celebrated his birthday with the inventor in Fort Myers were Henry Ford, Harvey Firestone, Herbert Hoover, Dan Beard and some of the "Edison Pioneers." It was out of these birthday celebrations that the Edison pageant of light during the week of Feb. 11 was born.

The last six years of his life, Mr. Edison concentrated on the discovery and production of an "emergency supply of rubber." He found what he wanted after making more than 100,000 experiments. He found a way to produce rubber from Solidago levanworthii—common goldenrod. It will grow in every state of the union, can be sown broadcast and reaped with ordinary machinery. All results of this last work were given

to the government as Edison's final gift to his country. It was a gift from an unselfish man and a man who really merited the title of "benefactor of mankind."

Note: From the first Pageant of Light in 1938, Ronald Halgrim was indispensable to Pageant committees. As a personal friend of the great inventor, visiting newspapermen found him of the greatest assistance in getting interviews. He was an authority on the history of the region and he knew Pageant tradition as an author knows his own works. The death of Mr. Halgrim in August, 1945, was a bitter blow, not only to his many friends throughout Florida, but particularly to his associates on this year's pageant committee. He leaves a gap that cannot be filled. This article, prepared by Mr. Halgrim for the 1941 Pageant program is a fitting part of this year's publication.

NE day when Henry Ford, Harvey S. Firestone, and Thomas A. Edison, three staunch companions for many years, were visiting Luther Burbank, the latter asked them to register in his guest book. Its final column was entitled "Interest in . . .". Here Mr. Edison wrote, "Everything."

That simple act, done with the quiet humor that characterized so many of his activities, typifies Thomas A. Edison. It reveals the characteristics that enabled him to contribute more than any other one man toward making the last 100 years the greatest period of progress the world has ever known.

The great electrical industries, railroads, motion pictures and radio, the building trades, automotive and aeronautical industries, chemical and plastic factories, metal mining operations . . . all of these and more base much of their development on the brilliant advances made possible in so large a measure by the genius of Edison.

Henry Ford, himself a great pioneer in improving the world's standard of living through industrial progress, once said, "It is the fashion to call this the Age of Industry. Rather, we should call it the Age of Edison, for he is the founder of modern industry in this country. He has done more to abolish poverty than any group of persons since the beginning of the world."

Yet Edison bequeathed to us far more than merely the material things which developed from his inventions. His discoveries transformed America and the world.

A great part of what Edison did is so much a part

of our lives that we forget how much we owe him. But now a notable group of the nation's leaders have established the Thomas Alva Edison Foundation. Its stated purpose is "to keep alive and active the genius exemplified in the life, accomplishments, and ideals of Mr. Edison and thereby to stimulate research and educational activities for the more effective advancement of human welfare."

The immediate objectives of the Foundation are three-fold: (1) The preserva-

tion of Edison's laboratories and library at West Orange, N. J., (2) The establishment there of the Edison Center for Invention, Discovery, and Research, one of the important activities of which will be to study and make available to all scientists the methods developed by Edison in making his own efforts so productive,

(3) The restoration of the nation-wide Edison scholastic competition so

that fundamental American concepts of life and government — free enterprise, for example — may be instilled in Young America.

To accomplish these and kindred purposes, considered judgment indicates that \$2,590,000 must be obtained from all sources conscious of their equity in Edison — both the great industries and the public they serve. This amount will finance for the next ten years the activities presently planned. It is further felt, with confidence, that under the direction of the officers and trustees, these and other projects will so well prove themselves that funds will be



forthcoming to perpetuate the work of the Foundation.

PROBABLY more than any other man, Edison was the creator

of that industrial civilization which has grown up around the research laboratory.

America now stands upon the threshold of her greatest era of industrial research, invention, and development. To attain the goals ahead, there must be men trained in the best methods of organized research. Experience shows that it is possible to develop thinkers and inventors just as we can educate people in other lines.

The Edison Foundation intends to establish in the library, laboratory, and adjacent facilities where the inventor worked for so many years the Edison Center for Invention, Discovery, and Research. This will not be "just another research laboratory." It will, for example, undertake research into the technique of research as practiced by Edison, and the results of this study will be made available to all scientists and research centers.

EDISON recognized that there is no substitute for hard work and sound thinking. To him there was no ceiling on achievement.

The Foundation believes in this principle and also realizes that leadership in science must be balanced by an appreciation of the rights of men to live together in harmony, and that our steps must be guided in that direction.

An immediate advance towards realizing this objective will be an annual competition among high school students throughout the country. Its purpose will be to stimulate self-development among the contestants as well as the awarding of a scholarship to the ultimate winner.

In this way will be revived the spirit of the original Thomas A. Edison scholarship award. The purpose of that award was "to stimulate the interest of the youth of America in mental development, with

particular emphasis on scientific matters and, more generally, in the high ideals that make for the highest type of American manhood."



THOSE now seeking to honor Edison include some of the nation's great leaders of science, industry, and education. These men will guide the Foundation in fulfillment of its purposes, making such adjustments in its objectives and in its administration as are called for by changing conditions.

We believe that, on the centenary of his birth, there are men of vision eager to develop a program to reinvigorate the Edison tradition. And, certainly, there also are men willing to invest in America's youth.

Edison endowed all mankind. As Mr. Charles F. Kettering, president of the Edison Foundation recently said, "Every citizen is as much a beneficiary of Mr. Edison as if he had mentioned him in his will."
